### **Energy grows on trees?**



Lee Moor is at a fascinating time in its history as it can now be heat self-sufficient, should that be necessary. For the winter period Toasty Heating Ltd has located some 40 tonnes of waste wood that otherwise would be rotting in the woods or be travelling the 100-mile round trip to Hexham to make chipboard. Far more sensible to bring it to Lee Moor and chip it straight into the bunker area for the boiler - this holds 30 tonnes plus and will keep the 150KW

#### **Environment - starter homes for the barn owls**

Rural affordable housing is not just a serious problem for the human residents of North Northumberland but also for the birds of prey operating in the area. Lee Moor has had barn owls, short-eared owls and little owls recently, and a number of owl boxes have been put in trees and on raptor poles over the years. Some of these lacked access doors, and once the jackdaws had filled them with "sticks and stones" then your average owl would consider the residence no longer fit for purpose. The answer from Philip Hanmer was an access door which also allows him - as a registered bird ringer - to watch for chicks and ring their legs when they get to a suitable age. Barn owls are at the top of the food chain and are therefore reassuring to see - as well as a very peaceful omen people drive down the long and winding road to Lee Moor Business Park.
